-Sure Intermediate:

The most important elements from Units 5 to 8: "Money matters"; "Use your imagination"; "Bright sparks"; "Do something!". Vocabulary referred, in general, to money, art, shapes, lines and patterns, environment, e-waste; Grammar: - the Future with Will/ Be going to+verb/Present continuous; - Revision of the Zero, First and Second conditionals + Third conditional (If/When...);

- Present and Past simple Passive; Continuous, Perfect and Modal passive.

Communication: inviting and arranging, refusing, discussing, expressing opinions, describing paintings, speaking about the environment.

- ICT:

Unit 2 – "Input, output and storage devices": Types of computers; The computer system; Computer storage; Bits and codes Part 2: How big is a bit? From valves to transistors and integrated circuits.

Unit 3 – "From mainframes to smartphones": Mainframes, the first electronic computers; Personal computers; Portable computers, notebooks and netbooks; PDAs, Tablets and smartphones.

Unit 4 – "Automation and robotics": Introduction to automation; Using PCs in Automation – microcontrollers; Open source computer boards; Domestic applications; Industrial applications.

Unit 5 – "Operating systems and software": A bit of history; Operating systems for personal computers; Mobile operating systems.

Unit 6 – "Application software": Word processors and spreadsheets; Presentation software; Graphics software; Development tools.

- Reading and comprehension of a passage from "Hard times" by Charles Dickens (present in our book Sure Intermediate); C. Dickens: historical period and the consequences of the Industrial Revolution.

- Show in English (December 13th): "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens, at the Brecht theatre in San Sisto, a coproduction between Oliver Page's school of languages (the English native teacher also plays the role of the main character of the novel) and the theatre association La Fontemaggiore.

- Reading in classroom (before the date of the show) of the theatrical script of "A



Christmas Carol", distributed by Fontemaggiore and the school" Help", slightly changed for the show.

- "Riflessi diVersi", Irish and Italian poets (external Project): reading and commentary of some poems, in classroom, chosen among the many poems presented by the authors: "Dunnarobba", "Pulizie di primavera" ("Spring cleaning") by Sergio Pasquandrea, translated by Eiléan Ní Chuilleanáin.

From social media, platforms and so on (above all during DaD):

- Individual listenings of songs by British or American singers talking about the present problems: Bono Vox and "Let your love be known", Zucchero and his "Canta la vita" together with Bono; "We'll meet again" sung by Vera Lynn in 1939 (during World War II);

- Individual listenings of speeches or short parts of speeches by important personalities (Queen Elizabeth II; Andrew Cuomo; Churchill) connected to the present situation as well as to the end of World War II.
