Vocabulary: school subjects, places in a school, school equipment.

Grammar: present continuous, present simple vs continuous; prepositions of place.

Functions: expressing preferences and wishes, giving reasons; describing photos.

Critical thinking: advantages/ disadvantages of homeschooling; benefits of game-centred learning.

Unit 3: You are what you eat!

To vary or not to vary...

Prepare with care!

Vocabulary: food and food types, common uncountable nouns.

Grammar: countable and uncountable nouns; some, any, no; how much, how many; a lot/ lots of, a little, a few, not much, not many.

Functions: offering, accepting, refusing politely; requesting and answering a request; describing food, talking about personal taste.

Unit 4: be inspirational!

Paula's blog: Today's thought – inspiration

It's not what you think

Vocabulary: personality adjectives; feelings and emotions.

Grammar: past simple: regular and irregular verbs, subject questions, could.

Functions: exchanging opinions; agreeing and disagreeing.

Critical thinking: inspirational people; "to judge a book by its cover; children are the future of any country. Education can free children from poverty.

Unit 5: Winning at any cost?

It isn't fair play!

Vocabulary: sports, sport places and equipment; parts of the body.

Grammar: past continuous, past simple vs continuous; must, have to, mustn't, don't/ doesn't have to.
